## The History of Free Masons In Royal Oak, Michigan

On a wintry evening in the year 1910 Masonic Bro. Dr. William Gass welcomed two distinguished local citizens into his Royal Oak home-office located on Washington Ave. between Fourth and Fifth Street. His visitors were his Masonic Brothers from Birmingham Lodge #44, Bro. Peter Backer (highway commissioner of Royal Oak Township) and Bro Charles Allen (president of the Royal Oak Village). As Dr. Gass escorted them into his parlor he poured each a cordial to warm their spirits from the cold outside air and they sat down to discuss Masonic fraternal affairs. Little could anyone have imagined where the discussion might lead. There was one very pressing problem, the difficulty that Royal Oak Village Masons had in getting to their Lodge located on Woodward Ave. at fifteen Mile Road. Royal Oak Lodge #464 secretary, W.B. Alvin Cook fondly recalls listening to the first elected Royal Oak Master, John C. Mow as he told stories of the 'early days' when travel to Lodge meant catching the Woodward Inter-urban rail service. At that time just getting to that service was difficult because roads were muddy, icy, or dusty through out the year. Horse-and-buggy or foot paths were the only way to the rail station and back home again. This problem was significant due to the heart felt attendance obligation that each Mason always has for his beloved Lodge.

As the ensuing conversation became more serious it was Bro. Backer who proposed the notion that Royal Oak Village needed its' own Masonic Lodge and Temple. The idea seemed interesting and the more it was discussed the more plausible it seemed. These three Masonic brethren now agreed that they must further investigate this possibility by interviewing other fraternal brothers. Dr. Gass recollected that just down the road from his Royal Oak home-office, less than a quarter mile away, on the SE corner of Fourth Ave. and Williams St., was an old school building, built in 1868, then called San Sara Hall. Conveniently, it was up for sale and though well aged it was a suitable size and location for a much desired fraternal meeting place.

The consideration of a local Royal Oak Masonic Lodge and Temple was met with enthusiasm by the local brethren. A few months later, in the Spring of 1910, a Masonic committee was assembled at Dr. Gass' home-office for further relevant discussion. Finally, this same committee reassembled at the target building, San Sara Hall, where they finally agreed to raise the asking price of the building, some \$3,500, by selling 700 shares of stock for \$5 each to local brethren.. The recommendation of this committee was well received and San Sara Hall was purchased in the fall of 1910 and turned into the first Royal Oak Masonic Temple. One year later, on May 11, 1911, dispensation was granted to form Royal Oak Lodge #464 which would then meet in the newly renovated but old building. The first Lodge meeting was held there only two days later. The new charter was late in coming and was granted on May 29, 1912. Still later, on July 25, 1912, Royal Oak Lodge #464 was constituted, dedicated and consecrated by Michigan's Grand Lodge. Royal Oak's first Masonic Temple was home to local brethren for the next 12 years and was also the first residence of Royal Oak Order of Eastern Star Chapter #392 and Royal Arch Masons Chapter #167. However, all was not perfect with these Masonic organizations now using this 44 year old structure. In fact, it was so rickety that during a Masonic Christmas party in 1915 the children had to be kept from romping around through the old upstairs school gymnasium because the floor weaved and squeaked too much. This tid-bit of information came to me courtesy of now deceased Royal Oak #464 Bro. Lloyd Watt who was at that party when he was five years old. In 1924 a new Royal Oak Masonic Temple building was erected at 412 S. Main St. between Fourth and Fifth Ave., exactly one block east of the homeoffice of Dr. Gass where the genesis of Royal Oak Lodge #464 began some 13 years earlier. The new dedication date was May 13, 1924. The ownership of this building was shared in a stock venture with the Royal Oak Order of Eastern Star #392. Eventually, Northwood Lodge #551 joined Lodge # 464, O.E.S. Chapter #392 and R.A.M. Chapter # 167 to form the Royal Oak Masonic Temple Corporation which has organized and transacted temple building activities ever since. (More to Come.....)



# Lodge Rental Fees Lowered

The Temple Board recently voted to lower the hall rental fees in an effort to encourage more use and generate funds for the operating budget. A member may now rent the hall on available weekends for \$75 plus a refundable \$50 cleanup deposit and a \$10 non-refundable lock up fee. Events must terminate at midnight.

Non-members may rent the hall for a \$150 fee plus a \$50 clean up deposit and a \$30 non-refundable lockup security fee

The hall will also be available for week day rental to anyone for a fee of \$20 per hour with a 3 hour minimum. A \$30 refundable cleanup deposit and a non-refundable lockup fee apply.
