NAC 551 Hosts Free Masonic Child ID Program



On Saturday, May 15, 2010, The Brothers of Northwood Ancient Craft Lodge 551 hosted a free Masonic Child ID program in conjunction with Kids Day America at the Van Every Family Chiropractic Center in Royal Oak.

The Michigan Masonic Child ID Program provides the family of a child with everything needed for the Amber Alert System. This includes a dental impression as well as a CD containing a

photo, digital fingerprints, and other vital information. The parents or guardians must fill out a permission slip for the child to receive this service. The Masons retain absolutely no records except for the permission slip.

This program is considered one of the most comprehensive programs of its type by the National Center For Missing and Exploited Children. In 2009 alone, this program identified more than 14,000 people in Michigan. We had over 100 children participate during our one day event.

The ready availability of this information to law enforcement and other agencies if anything were to happen to one of the children is absolutely crucial. Of course, we earnestly hope that no family will ever have to use this service that we have provided. It is just a fine example of Masons reaching out to our community and spreading the light of the Craft.
